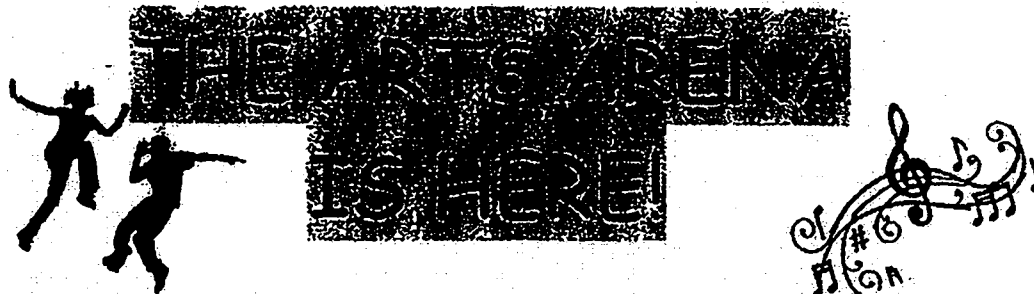

When David was thirteen, he and his mother encountered an unreliable durian seller who cheated them into buying durians of inferior quality. The seller made them pay for a superior quality durian. But when they got home, they found it was not what they had paid for.

This experience resulted in David starting a blog for durian lovers when he became an adult. That is where David and Sam first met online. They realised that they shared the same negative experiences with durian sellers and that their situation was not unique to them. 5

Tired of finding themselves at the mercy of unethical durian sellers and wanting to educate others, the two decided to start their own business. Both their parents were against their idea. What did they know about selling durians? The pair was so passionate about opening their business that their parents' opinion did not deter them. 10

It was tough going at the beginning and they were nervous because they knew nothing. Therefore, they decided to learn as much as possible about starting a durian business. They needed to know where to buy durians, how to cut open durians, and most importantly, how to tell the differences between durian types.

For the first month, they talked to durian lovers to see what type of durian people enjoyed eating. They made trips to durian farms in Malaysia and learnt about the 200 varieties of durians that were there. They talked to as many durian sellers as they could to get a better understanding of what it takes to run a durian business. 15

With information in hand, the partners were confident that they could operate a durian business and put things into motion. They gave up their good paying jobs and invested all their savings into this risky business. The night before their grand opening, neither of them could sleep. David kept thinking if he had forgotten something while Sam wondered how many durians they would sell. 20

Morning arrived and both men were at their stall early to make sure that everything was in place. At 10 a.m., acquaintances, friends and family came by. They wished them luck in their new business venture and bought durians from them. By 3 p.m., they had sold all their durians for the day. The partners were overjoyed with their success and decided to double the number of durians to sell the next day. 25

On the second day, the men were ready to do business. Again, the stall opened at the same time but there were no customers. An hour later, they had three customers. This was disappointing and they started doubting themselves. Time passed and by 7 p.m., they only sold half of what they had sold the day before. They were tired and had barely made any profit for that day. The two were down but not out. They promised each other that they would give themselves six months to see if their business would grow. They were going to show their parents they could do well. No matter how bad things were, they would bounce back. 30

It has been two years since they started and the business is doing well. However, it was a tough road to success. The work was physically and mentally exhausting. When asked if they had taken a risk in starting a durian business, they both agreed that it has been worthwhile. 35
