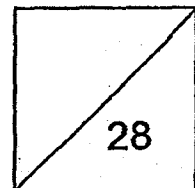

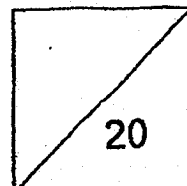

Just before midday on Christmas Eve, 1971, a plane with ninety-two people on board took off on a flight from Peru. Over the deepest part of the Peruvian jungle, it encountered a violent storm which caused it to break apart in mid-air. Julianne Muller, a seventeen-year-old German girl, was the sole survivor.

When she regained consciousness, she realised that she was lying in a row of seats that was upside down. Although she did not feel the pain from her broken collarbone, her swollen eye or the deep gashes on her arms and legs, she could not gather the energy to move. All through the night, she drifted in and out of consciousness. 5

The next morning, she unstrapped herself from the seat. Moving painfully, she started to explore the place. She found a small bag of sweets that was to be her only food for the next few days of her ordeal. She did not look for food in the jungle simply because she did not know what was edible. Before moving on, she armed herself with a long stick to help her walk through the thick undergrowth. This move was critical because she had lost her spectacles. 10

Meanwhile, helicopters were searching for survivors above the dense jungle but she felt helpless, unable to send them a signal. She was much too weak to climb trees as they were over thirty metres high. She tried looking for her mother but was unsuccessful. By this time, the site of the crash was full of the noise of vultures and flies. 15

On the third day, she discovered a tiny stream. Her parents had taught her that a person who was lost in the jungle should look for streams and follow them as they led to rivers. 20

However, progress was slow and painful. The stream was twisted and the banks were a tangled mass of roots. By now, she was also covered with insect bites. The journey was made arduous as she had one blowfly bite which had developed into a deep and painful wound filled with maggots. 25

On the fourth afternoon, the sound of the helicopters got nearer and nearer. Even though she knew it was useless, she yelled, "Hello! Help!" again and again. She never saw them but they must have been quite near. Once again, she was alone but her resolve was not weakened.

By the fifth day, the supply of sweets was exhausted. Her whole body was swollen as a result of insect bites. After nearly five days, she felt a glimmer of hope when the stream she had been following ran into a bigger river and she knew that her chances of meeting another person had been increased. 30

For the next few days, she swam and walked downstream. The lack of food and exposure to the heat made her weaker. Julianne considered eating the toads and the delicious-looking fruit she came across but resisted the temptation. She knew that in the jungle, beautiful things like the fruit could be dangerous. 35

At last, late in the afternoon of the ninth day of the crash, she came across a boat on the river bank. In a nearby hut, she found a bag of salt. She used it to treat her maggot-infested wound. 40

The next morning, she reasoned that it might be weeks before the boat owner returned. At the same time, she did not want to use the boat without his permission. Before she could make up her mind, it started to rain heavily. While waiting for the rain to stop, she heard voices. Her eyes lit when the door opened suddenly and two men appeared. After nine days in the jungle, Julianne Muller had been found. 45

Early the next morning, the men offered her food and prepared their boat for the trip down the river. She received medical treatment at the hospital. The doctor who examined Juliane remarked, "It's amazing you managed to walk through the jungle despite your torn ligament. Your survival is indeed miraculous!"

Under normal circumstances, one would have found it impossible to walk but 50 Juliane's courage and perseverance had kept her going.
