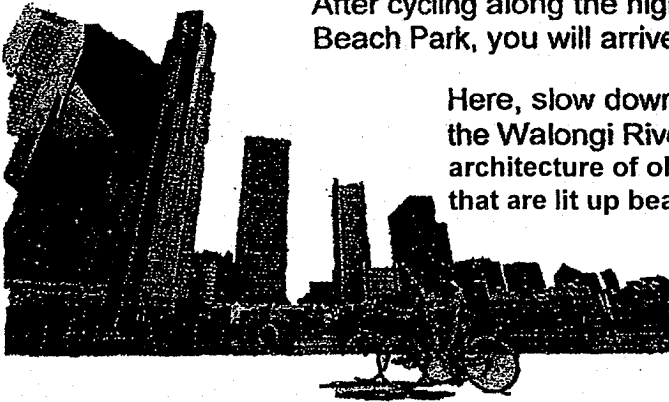

#### **Suggested Route 1: Along the Walongi River**



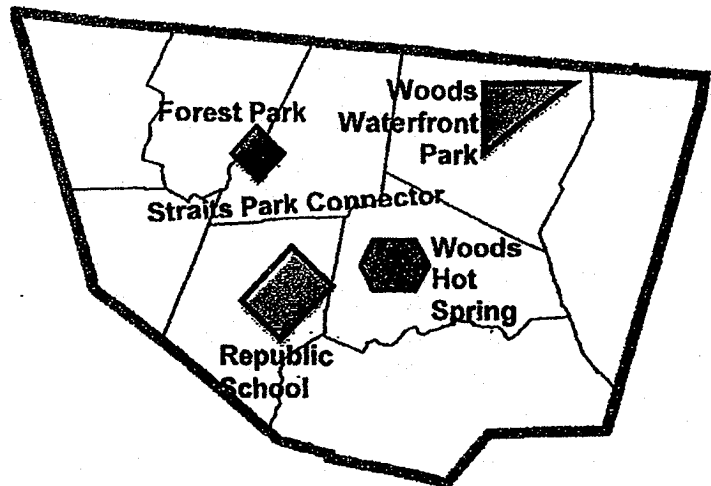
After cycling along the highway of Grange Coast Road and North Beach Park, you will arrive at the bank of the Walongi River.
