SINGAPORE TOY MUSEUM

**A toy museum to delight both adults and kids
with its vast collection of vintage toys from around the world.**

Tucked away in a secluded corner of Beechwood Road, what was once a barber shop is now home to the *Singapore Toy Museum*. Although not yet a household name, the *Singapore Toy Museum* has attracted a small but growing number of locals and tourists alike. Since it first opened in 2013, its only form of publicity is by word of mouth.

ONE MAN'S DREAM

The museum is the brainchild of David Wong who reveals that his passion for toys began with his very first toy - a gift of a small train by his father when he was seven. Over the years, he has assembled an amazing collection of toys from every corner of the world dating from Victorian times – charming wooden dolls – up to current computerized games.

David's collection became so vast that he decided to open a toy museum for the public's enjoyment. David's other reason for opening the toy museum was to allow him to carry on collecting the rarest of dolls, teddies, board games, trains and robots for display. Thus, visitors can see and admire these rare toys.

The MUSEUM

The museum opened in December 2013. Despite its modest exterior, the *Singapore Toy Museum* is home to over 5000 toys that David has painstakingly collected. Some of the toys have been donated by enthusiasts like him. One such donor, Mrs Esther Yap says, "My children and grandchildren have no interest in my old toys and I don't want to throw these treasures away."

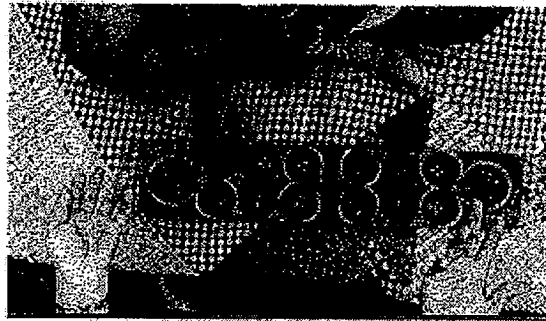
