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Section G: Comprehension 1 (8 marks)

Early yesterday morning, pupils arrived at Suntec Singapore Convention Hall for the biggest spelling competition. Many competitors were unprepared for the sight of over 1,800 seats at the preliminary round of the National Spelling Championship. Indeed, the 2016 spelling competition received its largest number of participants in its five-year history. Cheryl Wu, a primary five pupil who took part in the competition for the first time was shocked to see so many people taking part. 5

The round started easily, with competitors quickly writing down the first few words they heard from the audio recording. As words became trickier, many took longer to think before offering their answers.

Spellers had mixed reactions after the hour-long written test. Some found this year's preliminary easier than last year's. Others thought that the difficulty level was about the same. 10

Two words starting with "h" were among pupils' most commonly cited difficult words. 'Haberdashery' is a term for sewing materials, while 'herpetology' is a branch of zoology about amphibians and reptiles. 15

Addressing the participants at the end of the session, the organisers praised the pupils for their sportsmanship and perseverance. They also hoped that the participants had enjoyed and learnt from the competition.

After yesterday's round, only the top twenty spellers would qualify for the final round. They would then compete for the top prize of \$5,000 and the challenge trophy for their school. 20

The artist was sentenced to imprisonment for ten years. The king felt that the picture was a dishonour to a ruler showing a physical disability! 15

Then, the second artist showed his picture and even he was imprisoned for five years. The picture depicted the king having vision in both eyes. The king bellowed, "You are a dishonest man. You falsely praised me to earn a reward."
