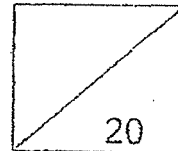

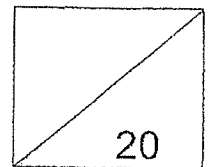

Today, at 85 years old, Madam Ng is retired and lives in a flat in Redhill. She is still healthy and cheerful, and does not let her age slow her down. She earns money by selling used cardboard that she collects from the neighbourhood.

Once a week, she goes to the Apex Club of Singapore where she receives a food package. She is grateful to the young volunteers there. Although she lives a simple life now, she chooses to see the brighter side of her situation. She feels fortunate that she is still in good health.
