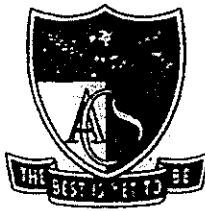

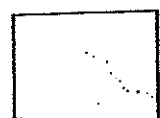

Slowly, Glenn's legs began to function once again.
