Many shells from the sea have very attractive colours and unique shapes. Collecting them was once a popular hobby and some of them are still worth a great deal of money.

The shiny patterned shell of the cowrie has been a favourite among collectors. The beautiful shell of this snail-like creature has many uses. It is thick to protect the cowrie from the powerful jaws of crabs and fish. There is a thin skin covering the shell that allows the 5 cowrie to breathe. When the cowrie is alarmed, it quickly retreats into its shell. The smooth surface of its shell allows it to do this easily. Once safely in its shell, the patterns and colours on the shell to camouflage the cowrie.

Some people pick up shells from beaches. Usually, the creatures that lived in them are already dead. However, some people collect live shells. To collect live shells, the 10 animals living in them are killed. Collecting live shells also often involves breaking up the reefs where they hide. When the reefs are destroyed, thousands of other creatures, such as fish and crabs, which live among them are made homeless.
