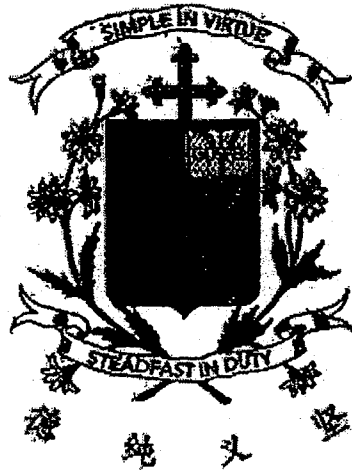

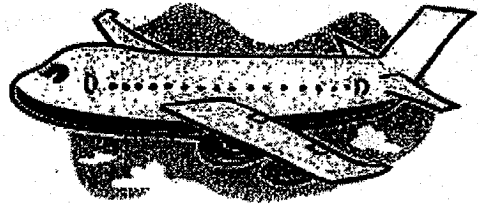

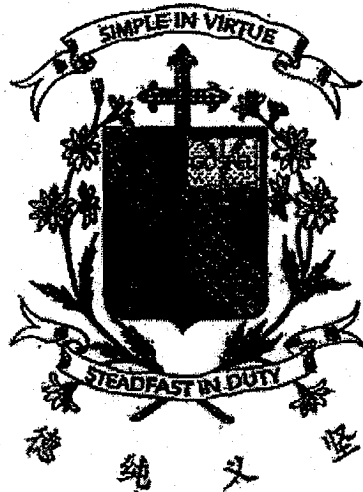

Colonel Harland David Sanders is best known for creating a fried chicken recipe that would lead to the formation of the world's fast-food chicken chain, Kentucky Fried Chicken, commonly known as KFC.

Sandera was born on September 9 1890 in the United States of America After his father died when he was 6 years old, Sanders became responsible for feeding and taking 5 care of his younger brother and sister. From the age of 10, he took up numerous jobs and worked as a farmer, a railroad fireman, and a soldier in the United States Army.

Later, he began cooking chicken for customers at a petrol station in Corbin, Kentucky However, for many years, his recipe was not well-received by his customers. Despite that, Sanders did not give up. He finally hit it big. He achieved his secret recipe of 11 herbs and 10 spices. The pressure cooker, a novelty at that time, was used by him for cooking his flavourful chicken. Using it reduced the preparation time and enabled him to serve more customers.

The fried chickens were so popular that the governor of Kentucky gave him the title 'Kentucky Colonel'. Kentucky Fried Chicken expanded internationally and it can be found in many countries around the world today. 15

Sanders passed on at the age of 90.

Even today, Sanders with his famous goatee, a white suit and a western string tie continues to symbolize delicious country fried chicken all over the world.
