It was the 1924 Olympics in France. Eric Liddell was a sprinter who was a potential gold medallist in the 100-metre dash. He trained hard to get into top shape.

However, when the schedule for the Olympics was announced and Liddell found out that the heats would fall on a Sunday, he said firmly, "I'm not running." He had set aside the day for God and wanting to stay true to his commitments, he withdrew from his best event. Many people were disappointed but this did not get him down. Instead, Liddell decided to take part in other races. On 7 July 1924, Liddell even turned up at the finals of the 100-metre competition to cheer the competitors from his country on to victory.

Liddell worked hard to train and build up his stamina for the new and longer 200-metre and 400-metre races. Critics were on a lookout to see how Liddell would fare. True enough, on 9 July 1924, many people criticised Liddell's performance in the 200-metre final competition. Although Liddell had won a bronze, the Scottish newspaper stated that Liddell did not perform as well as he should have.

Nonetheless, Liddell pressed on. On 11 July 1924, his perseverance finally paid off. The crowd went into a frenzy of enthusiasm as Eric Liddell won gold in the 400-metre race and broke the existing world record. When he was asked how he had managed to run so fast, Liddell responded, "The secret of my success is that I ran the first 200 metres as hard as I could. Then, for the second 200 metres, with God's help, I ran harder. I will always remember this triumphant moment!"

Throughout his athletic career, Liddell faced opposition from many sources as Liddell did not always do what people expected of him, such as running in his best event. Rather, his determination and dedication to God are an inspiration to everyone. Eric Liddell is truly a man who stood in the face of the supreme test of Olympic competition and never gave in.
