There has been some concern in Malaysia about the giant turtles which had come to nest on the beaches in Trengganu. Great efforts have been made to 19) _____ the giant turtles when they come out of the sea to lay their eggs in the sand.

These heavy turtles, weighing almost seven hundred kilograms each, drag themselves up the beach at night once a year during the egg-laying 20) _____. With their flippers, they dig deep holes in the sand and each can lay up to one hundred and fifty eggs. However, only one or two eventually survive till adulthood. The number of turtles nesting on the shores of Trengganu is 21) _____. Less than six hundred turtles showed up this year, while villagers reported numbers of more than a thousand a decade ago.

The problem stems from the fact that people want to make a sum of money from the turtles. They charge tourists 22) _____ fees to view the egg-laying. 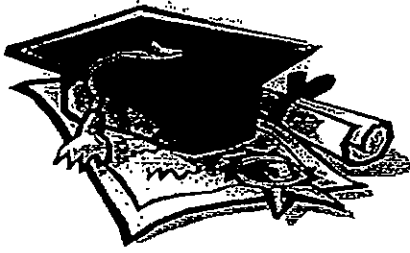
