Did you know that Singapore is home to the world's first night zoo? Opened in 1994, the Night Safari attracts visitors from all over the world who want to experience the magic of nocturnal animals. Unlike regular zoos, this unique park only opens after sunset, when many of its animals are most active. There are over 900 animals from 100 different species, many of which are rare or endangered.

Visitors can explore the park on foot along well-lit trails or take the popular tram ride that winds through seven different zones. Each zone looks like the natural habitat of its animals, from mountains to rainforests.

The park uses special lighting that looks like moonlight! This brilliant method makes the animals visible to humans but does not affect their normal activities. You might see Asian elephants taking a night-time stroll, fishing cats catching their dinner, or leopards prowling in the darkness.
