Claude Monet was born in Paris on 15 November 1840. His family moved to Le Havre when he was five years old. He loved to paint since young. He studied at an art school when he turned eleven. In 1856, Monet met Eugène Boudin, a French painter, who taught him how to use oil paints. Monet's mother encouraged him to become an artist, but his father disapproved. He wanted Monet to take over the family greengrocer business instead. 5

Years later, Monet moved to Paris to study at the Academie Suisse. Shortly after starting, he joined the French army but developed high fever and returned home reluctantly.

When Monet returned home from the army, he started trying new ways to paint. He painted outside and worked on how light affected his paintings. One of Monet's pieces was called 'Impression, Sunrise'. It was criticised because people thought his brushstrokes looked sloppy or unfinished. He welcomed the criticism as he wanted his art to be different. People began calling him Impressionists. They meant this as an insult, but Monet welcomed the name. He had started a new art movement called Impressionism. 10 15

His paintings started to become popular, and people began to buy them. He was inspired by the changes of light and the seasons. This led him to paint the same scenes many times to capture the changing light and seasons. One such scene was a pond at his home. He spent hours painting the water lilies. 20

During the First World War, Monet painted a series of weeping willow trees to represent French soldiers who had died in the war. He began to suffer from poor eyesight and had lung cancer. Monet died on 5 December 1926 and was buried in a cemetery. He is considered one of the greatest artists of all time.

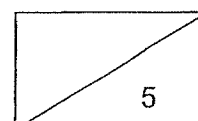

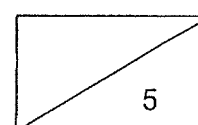
