It was about 6 p.m. on August 15, 2011. Mrs Tan had just put her daughter in the bathtub. She turned on the water and put the plug in the drainage hole. Then she remembered the fish she was frying that needed to be turned over.

"I figured I could leave to go into the kitchen to check on the fish," 5 she told the reporter. "But I was wrong. When I came back from the kitchen, I found Mary, my little girl, floating face-down."

Mrs Tan started cardiopulmonary resuscitation, better known as CPR. Soon, the medical team from the Singapore Civil Defence Force arrived. Mary was taken to the nearest hospital where she made a full recovery. 10

"Words cannot describe what I was feeling at that moment," Mrs Tan said. "It forever changed us as a family."

As a result of this near death experience, Mrs Tan became a volunteer with the Infant Swimming Resource, a programme that aims to prevent children from drowning through swimming lessons. Children as 15 young as six months can enrol in this programme.

"My goal is to help other people," Mrs Tan explained, "so that they do not have to go through the experience that my family and I had gone through."
