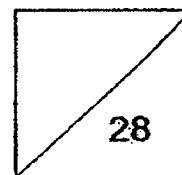

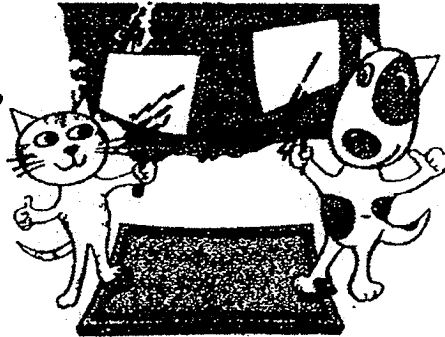

10 a.m. to 6 p.m.**



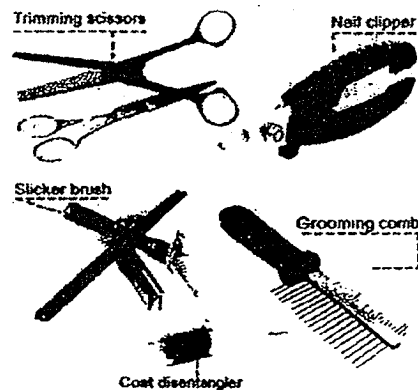

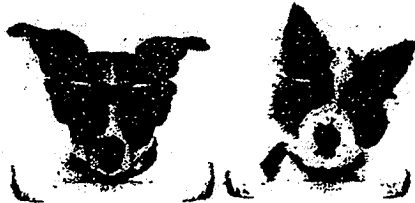
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ADOPT, DON'T BUY!

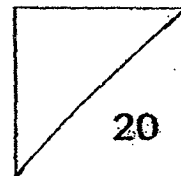
