As a teenager, Terry Fox lost a leg to cancer. While he was undergoing treatment in the hospital, he was (16) disturbed to see the suffering of fellow cancer patients. In his run, known as the "Marathon of Hope", Fox covered 45 to 48 kilometres per day, hopping on his actual leg and his prosthetic one. 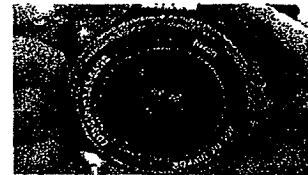

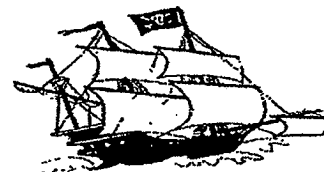
