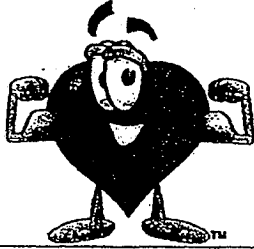

Something gave me courage to venture into the unknown and the result was one of the best nights of my life.
